Attendance Updates



Mr Dunn's class have taken an early lead in this term's class attendance challenge with 2 weekly wins so far, however there is still a long way to go!

Learning in Class

Year 6

Year 6 have been having great fun this term learning about how Micro:bit computers work. They have already created name badges and beating heart animations using our coding knowledge and this week we had a go at creating emotion badges. When the input device is pressed (a button for example) then a particular emotion would be shown on the LED display to show the output. Year 6 experimented and adapted the coding by adding sound affects when the buttons were pressed and some tried to shake, tilt or use the touch icon to give a wider range of emotions. Here are some of the children with their badges and some of the coding blocks they used.




Year 3

Year 3 have had a fantastic time exploring programming on Scratch, where we've enjoyed creating our own virtual bands! We learned how to sequence different sounds and change backdrops to enhance our music creations. In science, we've been investigating magnets and forces. We conducted an experiment to see which materials the car used more force on, and found that smoother surfaces allowed the car to travel farther. We were amazed to learn that F1 engineers use similar principles in their designs! We're also excited to apply our Roman knowledge during our upcoming trip and can't wait to see it all come to life.



In Other News



PE lessons

We would just like to take this time to remind families that PE lessons are part of the National Curriculum and it is therefore very important that the children take part in these lessons. This term, we have seen an increasing amount of pupils saying that they can't take part in lessons. Some of these pupils are then still participating in after-school sports clubs at school. This term, most children in school are taking part in 'dance' and 'yoga' sessions for their PE learning. These teach vital skills such as balance, co-ordination and flexibility. We understand that these activities may not be everyone's favourite, however it is still important to develop children's ability in these areas just like we develop children's maths, writing and reading. Moving forward, if children are unable to take part in a PE lesson, we will also say that they can't attend netball, football or cross country club for that week either. Please note, this is not about children with genuine illness or injury which might prevent them taking part in a PE lesson which we fully understand.



School Clubs

When we send information out about school clubs each term, we do clearly state that the children are making a commitment to attend that club for one big term (12 weeks.) We feel this is important because it teaches the children about commitment and responsibility. Recently, we have had some children drop out of clubs despite making this commitment and also not showing respect to the staff member by letting them know that they have decided to quit. With our value of the term being respect, we want to teach the children that just not turning up to a club is not acceptable and that it is respectful to

speak to the member of staff to say that they won't be attending anymore. If children do drop out of a club without committing to the full term then this may impact their chances of being selected for clubs in the future as we want to promote the values of dedication and reliability.

Headlice

We have had several families mention that headlice is becoming a recurring issue in some year groups. We understand that it is frustrating for families to treat headlice, only for your child to catch them again. It really does take a collective effort from all families to ensure that children's hair is being checked regularly and that headlice are being treated with proper treatment to ensure that we break the cycle and stop them spreading. We would advise that long hair is kept tied back and we will continue to send letters out when we have been informed of a headlice case within a year group.



ParentPay

After Easter, the school will be moving to use 'ParentPay' as the website for paying for school trips as well as other school admin. More detail will follow soon including how to ensure you are registered with an account etc.


