
Well done to RAS who are currently in the lead for our termly class attendance reward but there's still a few weeks to go!

Safeguarding

Some families are contacting school to say that there are people smoking near the school gates or continuing to wait with dogs near the school gates. 


Year 1

Year 1 have been learning all about the Great Fire of London and have been fantastic at sharing some facts all about this. They know that the fire started in a bakery on Pudding Lane in 1666. They have also spent some time learning about why the fire spread so quickly—windy conditions, houses built very closely together made out of wood and the lack of an organised fire brigade. They also learnt about how London looked when it was rebuilt after the fire. They have really become engrossed with this History learning and to provide further enrichment, we organised a workshop for the children with One Day Creative where they used role play and drama to further learn more about this key event in History.
