Attendance Updates

We just wanted to remind you about our policies for lateness. The gates for KS1 and EY shut at 8.50am and the gates for KS2 shut at 9.00am. After this time, your child will be marked as late. Every minute really does count. Our days start straight away, often with the teaching of phonics and reading. If children enter these sessions late, they have missed really valuable teaching. Some children also find it uncomfortable entering their classrooms late when all of their peers are already settled and beginning their learning so please can we urge families to really try and ensure that children are attending school on time.

If a child is 30 minutes late or more, this is marked as an unauthorized late and counts towards the threshold for a fixed penalty notice. 10 or more episodes of unauthorized lates will result in a fine being issued by the local authority.

Safeguarding



Learning in Class



Year 1

Year 1 are learning about the four seasons in science. They have been using our observation skills to look carefully at leaves and the identifying the correct leaf on our checklist. The children loved spotting the different types of trees the leaves came from. They even came to say they had spotted some holly on their way home as we hadn't managed to find any in our school grounds.





Year 5

This term, Year 5 have been learning about the artistic skill of perspective. They have been learning about the use of 'vanishing points' and 'horizon lines' to help them produce drawings that create depth. They have also been learning about Forces as part of their Science curriculum, where they have been able to build parachutes to demonstrate the effects of gravity and air resistance on an object. They had a lot of fun dropping them from the top of the stairs!

Lincolnshire Day


