
Attendance

Learning in Class



Year 1

As part of their PSHE curriculum unit about "Keeping Safe," Year 1 were visited by the Lincolnshire Road Safety Partnership who delivered a wonderful workshop for the children about road safety. The children learnt about how to stay safe when on or near roads and learnt a song to help them know to look, listen and think before crossing a road. The children

then went out on to the playground to put their skills into action and practise crossing a road safely. I think from the pictures below we can all agree that they did an incredible job.











As well as this, the children in Year 1 have been making their own poppies to link with their History topic about remembrance. They will then be writing their own instructions in English for how to make a poppy. I think they look beautiful Year 1!

Finally, in their Science learning this week, Year 1 went

for a walk outside to explore their senses, specifically what they could hear. They timed it perfectly as there was a helicopter flying past just as they went

outside! The children thought about whether the sounds that they could hear were quiet sounds or loud sounds. I was particularly impressed when I walked into this lesson and rather than telling me that they were doing Science, one of our wonderful children told me that this was indeed "Biology." I'm so impressed Year 1 - you have been so busy in all areas of your learning!

Year 5 have been building truss bridges in Design and Technology. They experimented with different ways to reinforce their bridges and have tested how strong their bridges are. They then placed weights on their structures. Great designing and building Year 5 - perhaps some engineers and architects of the future are amongst you!


Remembrance


Last week, the school council visited the International Bomber Command Centre for their schools remembrance service. It was a beautifully delivered service and involved finding out about a few of the individual stories of over 58,000 people who were involved in Bomber Command operations during WW2. The children then found the names of these men on the memorial walls and put their poppies in to show their respect for the sacrifices they made.

On Sunday, Phoebe, Darcie-Bay, Riley and Lily represented St John's at the remembrance service at church reading poems and prayers. I couldn't have been more proud of their delivery, confidence and respect shown and they read their parts with a clear understanding of how significant their words were. I'd like to thank them and their families for coming to this service and representing St John's so incredibly well. It was also lovely to see other pupils there as part of their Beavers and Brownie groups!

On Monday, a group of Year 1 and Year 6 pupils visited the local memorial to lay a wreath on behalf of all the St John's Primary Academy community. The whole school participated in the 2 minute silence to remember those who gave their lives and those who continue to serve in the armed forces now.

We have explored what this means in assemblies and the children have been completing activities in their classrooms. On Tuesday we all wore odd socks to show that it is OK to be different and to celebrate what makes us unique! This week, we also relaunched our playground buddies scheme. We have a new set of children who have been trained as playground buddies for this year. They take it in turns to be on 'duty' and to look out for anyone at the buddy stop who may be feeling lonely or want some help. Our playground buddies use the CALM approach—
