

Attendance Updates

We continue to strive for excellent attendance across the academy and we're thankful for the support we receive from our families in ensuring that pupils are in school as regularly as possible. Collecting Early

Curriculum and Learning



Year 5

Last week, Year 5 met with their partner school, The Egyptian Japanese School in Samannoud. Together, we are taking part in a joint project about Climate Change. We have looked at the Sustainable Development Goals and have decided to do our project about the changes in our weather in Lincolnshire due to the fact that we have had lots of flooding this year. The Sustainable Development Goals are the blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all. They address the global challenges we face, including those related to poverty, inequality, climate change, environmental degradation, peace and justice. The 17 Goals are all interconnected, and in order to leave no one behind, it is important that we achieve them all by 2030. This is a fantastic opportunity



for Year 5 to really develop as Global Citizens and it's incredibly exciting to be partnered with a school and be able to chat with other children so far away!

Reception

In Early Years our topic this term is Amazing Animals. We have been thinking about some life cycles and how to look after different animals. In the classroom we currently have some eggs in an incubator that are due to hatch next week (fingers crossed), some frog spawn and a wormery. The children are enjoying thinking about the different animals that might hatch from an egg and observing the changes that are taking place. There were definitely some very excited children when I popped in last week who used some fantastic vocabulary when showing me the wormery!

Gardening club is back! The strawberries are re-growing, the daffodils have flowered and we have just planted our potatoes. Great work gardening club.








In Other News

World Book Day




WORLD

To link with the theme of colour, we shared the beautiful poem below:








