Attendance for the year to date:




Attendance Updates


Please can we remind families that the start of the day for EY/KS1 is 8.50am and so the doors open at 8.40am. We are seeing a number of children in EY/KS1 be late because they are arriving in time for their older siblings to come through the KS2 gates at 9am. We begin phonics and reading teaching straight away so this means children are missing out on their crucial learning time in these key subjects. KS1 children should be dropped off at their gates / doors before 8.50am to ensure they are ready to start their day on time.

Illness and Holiday Absences

Please can we ask families when reporting absence for illness to give a clear reason for illness. We are having some voicemails and emails reporting absence which just says that a child is "unwell" We are expected to record a specific reason for absence so we need to know what the illness is e.g. tonsilitis, chicken pox, sickness etc. This will help ensure we are recording absences correctly in line with our attendance policy.

Please note that with any absences that are reported as illness but are attached to a requested holiday, we will conduct a home visit again to ensure that we are coding attendances correctly e.g. if a holiday has been requested for 4 days and a 5th day is reported as illness, a member of the attendance team will complete a home visit to be assured that the correct absence code is being used. If we have reason to suspect that a family may be on holiday and they have not let school know this, it is the trust policy to ask for evidence to show otherwise.





Learning in Class



Year 3

Year 3 were very lucky to explore Stone Age, Bronze Age, and Iron Age artefacts in the classroom. They examined each object closely and drew detailed sketches, paying attention to tiny clues that might help them work out what the artefacts were and how they were once used. Before learning their true identities, they shared their own ideas, using evidence from their observations to support their thinking. This hands-on investigation helped them understand how historians piece together the past. It also strengthened their critical thinking skills, encouraging them to ask questions, make predictions, and think like real archaeologists.





Year 3 have also been busy developing their sewing skills, practising neat and accurate running stitch and cross stitch, as well as learning how to applique different fabrics. Everyone has shown great focus and improving dexterity as they work with needles, thread, and material. They are now excited to begin designing their Christmas cushions, planning how to incorporate all the techniques they've learned. Later in the term, they'll bring our designs to life by making the cushions themselves. It's been wonderful to see the children's creativity, confidence, and independence grow as they prepare for this festive textile project.

Year 4

This week Year 4 enjoyed a workshop about Volcanoes and Earthquakes. The children took part in many different drama activities including a gameshow about the different tectonic plates, freeze frames to show the three different ways a volcano can be described - active, dormant or extinct and a game using different actions to show the different parts of a volcano. Even the staff managed to have a go but didn't last very long before they were out. As you can see the children had lots of fun!





Learning in Class



Year 2

Year 2 have been learning about explorers in their History learning this term and had a workshop this week with One Day Creative all about Neil Armstrong and the Moon Landing. There was much excitement in the classroom and I walked past at one point to American flags being waved with great enthusiasm! The children acted out parts of Neil Armstrong's life and learnt more about the Moon and Space. It was very much enjoyed by all.









Year 6

Year 6 have been thoroughly enjoying their drawing unit this term. They have experimented with mark making and wax resist techniques inspired by the sketches of Henry Moore. He was an artist and sculptor who created images such as this one showing the people of London sheltering from the Blitz in the underground tunnels, which links to their History learning about WW2.

This week, they focussed on creating different forms to give a 3D impression. They tried drawing some 3D shapes, noticing where the light hit the object and where shadows were cast. They then had a go at drawing some mannequins in different poses. It took a lot of concentration, and they had to add detail to their sketches through shading and using the techniques they have been learning. They were very proud of their attempts and thought about how they could improve them even

UK Parliament Week


This week is UK Parliament Week—a week aimed at helping children understand more about Parliament, how Government works and how laws are made. My assembly to KS2 this week was on this theme and I was very impressed with what the children knew about our Prime Minister and some even knew who our local MP is. We learnt about the difference between the House of Commons and the House of Lords and the children learnt some key terms such as 'bill,' 'act,' 'debate,'and 'petition.' They also found out that their voice matters and the different ways they can raise issues which are important to them.






In Other News
