Attendance Updates

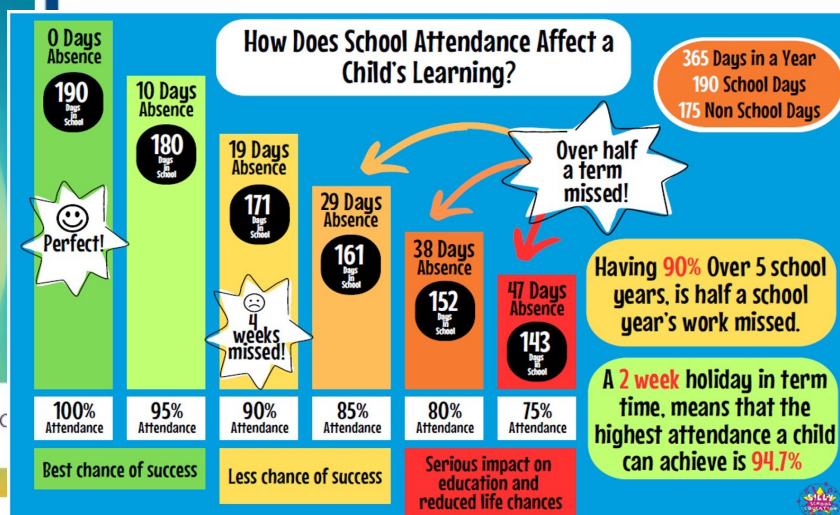
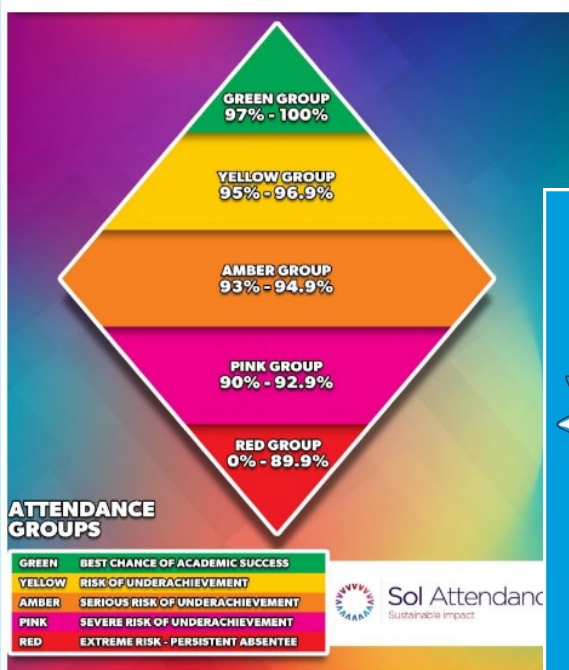
Please can we remind families that the start of the day for EY/KS1 is 8.50am and so the doors open at 8.40am. We are seeing a number of children in EY/KS1 be late because they are arriving in time for their older siblings to come through the KS2 gates at 9am. We begin phonics and reading teaching straight away so this means children are missing out on their crucial learning time in these key subjects. KS1 children should be dropped off at their gates / doors before 8.50am to ensure they are ready to start their day on time.

Illness and Holiday Absences

Please can we ask families when reporting absence for illness to give a clear reason for illness. We are having some voicemails and emails reporting absence which just says that a child is "unwell" We are expected to record a specific reason for absence so we need to know what the illness is e.g. tonsillitis, chicken pox, sickness etc. This will help ensure we are recording absences correctly in line with our attendance policy.

Please note that with any absences that are reported as illness but are attached to a requested holiday, we will conduct a home visit again to ensure that we are coding attendances correctly e.g. if a holiday has been requested for 4 days and a 5th day is reported as illness, a member of the attendance team will complete a home visit to be assured that the correct absence code is being used. If we have reason to suspect that a family may be on holiday and they have not let school know this, it is the trust policy to ask for evidence to show otherwise.

Learning in Class

Year 3

Year 3 have been developing their sewing skills to make festive Christmas cushions. They have been practising running stitch, cross stitch and applique to bring their designs to life. Everyone has shown fantastic concentration and creativity as they carefully sewed each part of their cushion. It has been wonderful to see how confident the children have become with their stitching. We are all so proud of their work and they cannot wait to take their finished cushions home to share.



Year 6

Year 6 had a fascinating visit to the National Holocaust Centre this week. They explored some WW2 artefacts and used the primary sources to discover what life was like for German Jews in the lead up to the Second World War. The children were very knowledgeable and asked some thoughtful questions. In the afternoon, they followed The Journey exhibition which tells the story of a young boy called Leo and how his life changed in the 1930's before the war. The children heard diary extracts and visited his living room, school and a street which had been destroyed during the Night of Broken Glass (Kristallnacht). They heard video testimony from a real Holocaust survivor who travelled on the Kindertransport, which links to our class novel this term 'Letters from the Lighthouse' by Emma Carroll. The children were well behaved and respectful on the visit and really showed our St John's S.T.A.R Champion behaviour. Well done year 6.



Year 4

Over the term, Year 4 have been busy working on a brilliant biscuit-baking project. The children began by looking at different biscuit packaging and recipes, talking about what information they give and how they are set out. They then followed a simple biscuit recipe and adapted it by choosing an extra ingredient to make their own unique flavour. The children loved the practical side of the unit, and it was great to see their confidence grow as they read instructions, measured ingredients and worked together in the "kitchen." The biscuits were a real treat too!

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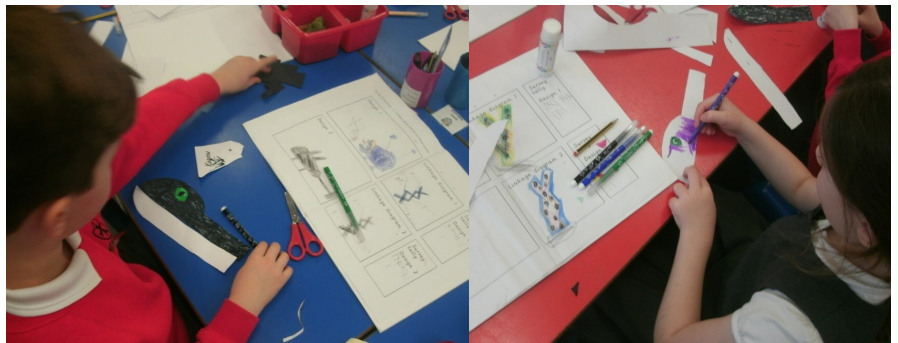
Early Years

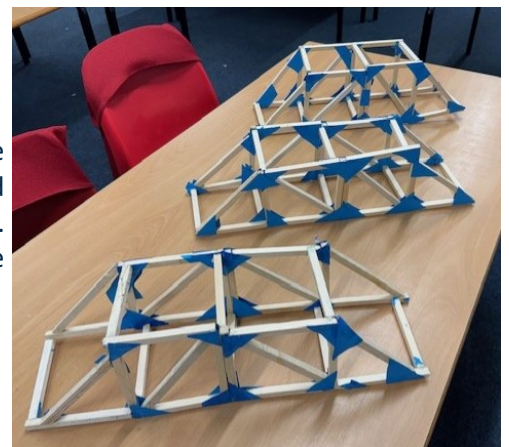
Year 2
