Attendance Updates

A letter was sent out at the start of the week outlining the new attendance processes and policies we will be following in line with the Priory Academies trust.

Please note that any leave of absence needs to be requested on the form that can be found here. Term time holidays will not be authorised.

We are following the new DfE national framework which sets out guidance for issuing fixed penalty notices for unauthorised absences.

The threshold is 10 sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absence in a rolling period of 10 school weeks. The fixed penalty notice will be £80 per child, per parent if paid within 21 days or £160 if paid within 28 days.


If another period of unauthorised absence follows and the threshold is met again with a 3 year period, the fixed penalty notice is £160 per child, per parent if paid within 28 days.


If the threshold is met for a third time within a 3 year period then other action such as prosecution or other legal interventions may be taken by the local authority.

Mrs Jefferson is the school attendance lead and can support with any attendance queries.

Our 100 club is back up and running for this term—this resets at the start of every new term to allow more possibilities for pupils to be rewarded.

Curriculum and Learning



Value of the term—Kindness

This week we have been exploring our value of the term 'Kindness' in our assemblies. We spoke about how we all carry around an invisible bucket with us. When people show us kindness, our bucket fills. This makes us feel happy and positive about ourselves. When we're kind to other people, our bucket also fills because it feels good to be kind. I have set each class a challenge - they all have a kindness bucket and this term, any acts of kindness observed by anyone in our school will be put into the class bucket with the aim being to



have an overflowing bucket by the end of term. Of course, we know some acts of kindness aren't seen and these are the ones often that have the most impact so we have discussed this too. All of our staff are involved including our lunchtime and admin staff who are all on the look out for that kind behaviour. At the end of the term, each class will empty their buckets during class reflection time and look back on the all acts of the kindness experienced during the term and how this makes them feel and the impact on them.

Fairtrade Fortnight

We are proud to be participating in Fairtrade fortnight this year raising awareness on the importance of Fairtrade and supporting our pupils to become global citizens. Fairtrade is about ensuring that farmers in developing countries get a fair price for their crops. Supporting Fairtrade also means that these farmers receive training and support on sustainable growing methods as well as financial support and advice to be able to support their families. It is important that our children are aware that sometimes things are unfair and to educate them on what we can do to make things more fair. To coincide with Fairtrade fortnight, we will be running our own stall at St John's selling all kinds of Fairtrade treats. Not only are they delicious but by purchasing, we will be supporting farmers and their families. The stall will be on the KS2 playground each afternoon next week after school. It will be cash only and please bring change if possible. I can't promise how long the products will last—there are some rather delicious looking cookies, flapjacks and chocolate bars for sale!

EYFS have a brand new outdoor learning environment!

We would like to take this opportunity to welcome all of our amazing Reception children into the St. John's school family. We are so proud of the way you have all settled into your new environment and routines. It is so lovely to see so many smiling faces and to be able to watch those children who are a little bit unsure develop and grow as the days go on. We are so lucky to have a wonderful new outdoor learning environment, which has changed so dramatically over the summer. The children (and adults!) have loved exploring all of the new resources. We can pump water down our new stream, dig in the huge sand pit and let our imagination and creativity shine in the construction area which has its own skip full of building materials. My personal favourite is the covered area with a coloured Perspex roof that creates rainbows on the floor as the sun shines through.









Year 2 Art

Year 2 have been using drawing pencils. They have learnt about the different grades of pencil and experimented with tone and how to make light and dark marks. I think their experimenting looks wonderful. I can't wait to see these tones being applied in their sketches and drawings as the year goes on!







Year 4

The new Year 4 children have settled amazingly well into their new classrooms. They have started to learn about the Ancient Greeks in History and have learnt that if they were a boy, they would have had to leave the home and train in the army from as young as 7! In Science, they have thought about the properties they can use to describe either a solid or a liquid and are excited to find out about the changes between the two. In our Maths, the children have looked at 4 digit numbers and how they can be partitioned in different ways.


