

Our class attendance challenge also resets and will now run until the Easter break. I wonder if 2F will aim to win again or if we'll have a new class take the crown.




Learning in class

Behaviour



This term, we are making a few changes to some of our behaviour systems and processes as part of our culture and ethos of 'championing children.' This has included reviewing our school rules and making sure they are simple and easily understood by all, and then helping the children to understand what our expected standard of behaviour is. We are also looking at our rewards and recognitions and how we notice children trying exceptionally hard and going over and above with their behaviour. We are also going to be developing our house system and making this an integral part of school life and the sense of teamwork and collaboration between peers that belonging to a 'house' can bring.

We have simplified our school rules which have been shared with all children this week. We think these are easy to remember and easy to understand whatever age you are. The children have had lessons this week teaching them the rules, but more importantly, what they mean and what they look like so that everyone is clear.

Our rules are:







We have also taught every class our new 'motto' to help us define what excellent behaviour at St John's looks like. We are calling it S.T.A.R Champion behaviour and this forms the basis of the behaviour we want to see from our pupils. This will start to form the beginnings of our rewards and recognition systems and will support in how

we discuss behaviour with the children, meaning all staff will follow the same approach.

Finally, every class has introduced a 'recognition board.' Each day the teacher chooses a focus for their class. This can be anything from excellent manners, super lining up, active listening, sensible walking etc. The focus gets put on the board and the recognition board aims to spot the children who are doing this well. It encourages positive noticing by all staff in the school and it's a collaborative team effort of trying to get all the

names on the board by the end of the day / 2 days that it's running for. Children can also nominate their peers to be put on the board if they think they've seen them showing the behaviour but they haven't been spotted by the teacher yet. It's designed to be a positive focus and to praise what we want to see and our S.T.A.R champion standard.

We will keep communicating any other changes we make regarding our behaviour approach and policies and seek your views over the coming months.
