
Please can we remind families to complete the form that can be found <u>here</u> if a leave of absence is going to be taken whether this for a holiday or another reason.

## **Learning in class**



#### Year 1

In their Science, Year 1 have been learning all about plants and flowers. They have been looking particularly at roots and that there are two types of roots—tap roots and branching roots. The children observed closely and had a go at drawing these different types.







#### **Early Years**

Sam said that "The children were all so SO lovely - all fully engaged with the city, using the toys and areas appropriately and their listening skills were fab! The children's behaviour was so good and I loved how their imaginations ran wild in the different areas". Sam arrived early and set up her Little City in the hall. The children explored all of the areas with great enthusiasm, interest, creativity and imagination. ## **Learning in class**




#### Year 3

Year 3 have been learning about the Ancient Egyptians. They have been engrossed in learning the process of mummification which they are writing instructions about in their English lessons. To deepen this understanding, they have mummified a tomato in the classroom. They have to wait 40 days to see if it worked! They have linked this learning to their Design and Technology where they are making pneumatic toys. Some of the children have made Ancient Egyptian sarcophaguses where the ancient Egyptian treasure will jump out and some of them have designed a more modern-day toy. They have loved learning about the movement of air to make the toy work. It was fun seeing how far they could pop the syringe when there was too much air for the syringe to hold.



#### Year 6

Year 6 have been busy rehearsing for their Year 6 production of Oliver with a Twist! The children are embracing the challenge of learning their lines and have been helping to choreograph the dance routines for the musical numbers. They are really looking forward to being able to perform for everyone and know that it is going to be a fantastic show.
