

Learning in Class



Year 3

Year 3 had a fieldwork trip to the River Witham to see some of the features they had been learning about in their Geography unit. They had a great time looking at the environment and checking things like the flow rate by timing how long sticks took to go between two points. They were also very happy to see different wildlife in the area as well. They came back to school full of information which they have then been showcasing in their writing - creating information texts about water and rivers! Well done Year 3.

Year 2 have been very busy. In Art, they have continued to use hatching, cross hatching and stippling skills to re-create pictures and sketch real life objects.
