Attendance Updates

The DfE continues to make attendance a priority and the Working Together to Improve School Attendance document becomes statutory from August 2024.

After Easter, we will be writing to all families detailing the attendance policy to be implemented at St John's from September 2024. This will be in line with the Priory Federation of Academies Trust attendance policy and framework. This will highlight some key changes to how the school will respond to unauthorised holidays in term time and we will ensure you have full clarity on this in the coming weeks. We continue to urge families to not book holidays in term time.

We aim to continue supporting families to ensure attendance is as high as possible so that the children are achieving as much success as possible at St John's.


If you want to discuss anything related to attendance, then please don't hesitate to contact the school office.

We have been inspired by the artist Mike Barrett. We studied some of his work and created a self portrait by using our sketching skills. We used pens to add shading with hatch marks and tried to keep the facial details simple. Following that, we used collage, water colour and pens to create a personalised background which would make our black and white images 'pop' off the page. We chose some of our favourite colours and thought about our hobbies and interests to make our work unique. The final step was to take a photo of the images and then, using Paint software, add more details and textures. 'I liked having the freedom to be creative and see where the art would take me' said one year 6 pupil.




FoS

So would we! From Easter, we are adding new clubs with Dance for KS1, Drama for Years 3 and 4 and Magical Maths for Y1-6. We have also sourced a new Art club to start from September. We will swap which year groups access these clubs each term. We continue to run choir, signing choir, gardening and our sports clubs too.

In terms of trips, we'd love to offer more and we're currently looking at which trips best enrich our curriculum. However, we are finding that we're receiving less contributions for trips than ever before and without these, we simply cannot afford to run the trips. We appreciate that the cost of living has made finances much tighter and we endeavour to keep the cost of trips to a minimum but cuts to school budgets mean we simply can't finance these by our self. Your contributions make a huge difference in a trip being able to go ahead so we'd love to offer more but please contribute where possible.

We would love to welcome parents into school more and for you to have the opportunity to be more involved. 


The Heath Village Hall and Library
