

## **Learning in Class**




#### **Early Years**

In Early Years, their topic is Marvellous Me. They have been outside and made some Nature Friend Puppets with their own special Superpower connected to their book of the week 'A Superpower Like Mine'. The children decorated a wooden tool (very kindly donated by local company Colour Me Lincoln) as a character with a superpower. We encouraged the children to make up a name for their puppet and talk about their superpower. We also looked at the different natural materials that they could use to help create their character and linked it to Autumn and the effect of the changing seasons on the natural world around them.









#### Year 3

Over the past few weeks, Year 3 have been diving into the wonderful world of the ukulele! Each lesson, they've learnt new chords and become experts at finger placement — helped by their colourful sticker guides on the fretboards. They have put our growing skills to the test by playing songs from artists like Taylor Swift and Bruno Mars, which really challenged them to switch between chords smoothly and keep in time with the music. The children have shown brilliant focus, teamwork, and enthusiasm. It's been fantastic to see so many budding musicians growing in confidence — we might just have a few future ukulele stars in the making! Mr Broadley, our ukulele teacher, is very impressed!







#### Year 6

This term in year 6, the children have been learning all about Animals, Plants and Micro-organisms. They have looked at Carl Linnaeus and his Taxonomy chart to help them sort animals into vertebrates and invertebrates and then into further classes such as mammals, fish, birds and amphibians. To help with their understanding about micro-organisms, they have set up an experiment to see which conditions are the best for mould to grow. They have placed some bread into food bags and placed them in random places around the room such as on the windowsill, in the fridge, in cupboards and behind some trays. They are going to check the bread regularly until the end of term to see what happens to the bread and which condition is the best, or worst as the case may be!

#### **World Mental Health Day**

This week in our assemblies, we looked at World Mental Health Day which is on the 10th October each year. We spoke about what mental health means and how it's about looking after our thoughts and feelings. In Early Years and KS1, we used the colour monster to help us with this. In KS2, we looked at the theme which this year focuses on when global news and events can feel overwhelming. We explored how often what we see in the media is a lot of bad news and this can have an impact on our mental health. I showed the children a resource called Be Happy News where,




every week, a positive news leaflet is published and it includes stories of good news from all across the world. You can find copies of this here if it's something you would like to use at home as well — Be Happy Resources


## **In Other News**

# What parents need to know about



## EXPOSING YOUR CHILD'S EXACT LOCATION

The 'Snap Map' lets you share your EXACT location in real-time through a map on the app. The user's location updates when the app has been opened on the device. There is a warning on the Snapchat sebsite about uploading images and videos to 'Ou Story, stating that "snaps you submit to 'Our Story can still show up on the Map, no matter which location setting you choosel." When uploading to 'Our Story,' your child's image or video could appear In "Search results and Stories on or off Snapchat today or in the future."

#### LENS EXPLORER

The Lens Studio' on Snapchat gives users the freedom to use their imagination to design their own filters for themselves and others to use. Snapchat states that the lenses users create 'must comply with our Lens Studio Submission Guidelines and Community Guidelines and must be appropriate for Snapchatters ages 134, "The Lens Explorer in the app now enables users to choose from thousands of these creations to after their snaps. Anyone can create a lens for Snapchat, which gives opportunities for age-inappropriate content to be uploaded.

#### **SCREENSHOTS & SAVED** MESSAGES

While Snapchat's gimmick is that all photos, videos and text disappear eventually, users still have the capability to screen shot or record anything which has been sent to them. Users may sometimes forget that screenshotting is possible and send a ompromising image or message to somebody wh they think they trust. They may also accidentally send an image or message to somebody who they do not trust. Simply by pressing and helding a message, the user is able to save a message they have received, which can be screenshotted or used against them at a later date

#### SNAPSTREAKS & ADDICTION

'Snap Streaks' are gained when snaps have been sent back and forth consecutively between friend The longer that snaps are sent between users, the longer the streak becomes. Furthermore, Snapchat rewards users who have achieved high Snap Streaks, by gifting emojis, adding incentives for users to keep the streaks. Children invest time into making their streaks as long as possible, which can put an incredible amount of pressure on both themselves and their friendships.


#### SEXTING

Due to 'Snaps' disappearing, (users can even send a one-second photo or video), Snapchat has become the chosen platform for children and young people to send sexually explicit images or 'selfies.' Once a photo/video has been screenshotted, or recorded using another device or software, this can lead to further dangers, such as blackmail and cyberbullying. It is illegal to make, possess, download, store and share sexual images, photos and videos of a person under the age of 18. This also includes any sexual images, photos and videos that a child may have taken of themselves. However, if a young person is found creating or sharing images, the police can choose to record that a crime has been committed, but taking formal action isn't in the public interest.

#### SNAP ORIGINALS

Through 'Snap Originals', users can watch content which has been created by Snapchat on the app, including comedy shows, drama, news and more. Additionally, there are new lenses and filters available, inspired by the 'snap originals' shows. This is another feature to encourage addiction.
