
#### The 100 club


We have 166 children with 100% attendance this term which is fantastic! All of these children were entered into our 100 club draw and the two winners from EY/KS1 and KS2 are:




#### **Sports Day**

The idea is that this will support the children's understanding of chronology and will be a resource which can be used as part of their History lessons to understand when key events happened in the past. It also has key local history dates including the opening of St John's Primary School in 1880 and the school joining the Priory Federation of Academies Trust in 2024.




#### **Summer Reading Challenge**
